During the period Woody was successful in securing seven paid contracts for woodland management and associated work. These were primarily secured with the local authority, Hyndburn Borough Council. Of these contracts with the council, the vast majority were for thinning of 'undermanaged' woodlands that had been planted 20-30 years ago

The work was undertaken by volunteers with additional 'bought in' support and technical experience as an when required. The sites that Woody worked on were all in the ownership of Hyndburn Borough Council and are well used by the public. These sites included The Coppice, Arden Hall, Jackhouse Nature Reserve, West Accrington Recreation Corridor, and Royds Street Woodland.

One of the prime aims of Woody is to promote the sustainable management of woodlands in Hyndburn and to create products for sale in the local area. We want to promote the use of local timber as opposed to products shipped in from across the world. (See cont sheet 1)

During the year we managed to utilise the majority of the timber arisings from management operations. With each piece of thinning work we produced an amount of timber, mainly tree trunks and large branches, that we then turned into products that we then sold on to the public or gifted to other groups. These included firewood, charcoal, planking, bird boxes, waymarkers and seating. Towards the end of the year we purchased a portable chainsaw mill (a Logosol M8) in order to maximise the range of products that we could produce from the arisings

With regard to the promotion and protection of biodiversity, all the woodland management contracts that we undertook on behalf of the council were for the benefit of the woodlands, I e removing invasive tree species to encourage more beneficial species such as Oak We also undertook two contracts on Biological Heritage Sites removing Alder trees to benefit a rare plant (Yellow Bird's Nest) at West Accompton site and to promote Bryophytes on another (Jackhouse)

With regard to enhancing the amenity value of woodlands in Hyndburn for healthy lifestyles the vast majority of the paid work that we undertook, on behalf of the council, was for woodland management works in popular and very well used public parks such as the Coppice, Arden Hall, West Accounted Recreation Corndor and Jackhouse Nature Reserve On all these sites the works involved either thinning planted woodlands to encourage native trees, removal of invasive tree species for plants and Bryophytes and finally to thin out dense woodlands that can be intimidating for lone walkers etc. Our work on the Coppice was part of a larger council scheme to improve this public open space. Overall improvements included new footpaths and signage as well as the woodland works

Our directors are volunteers and give their time as such apart from occasions where we need to buy in their expertise in relation to more complex felling operations and also the administration of the company and securing contracts During the year we undertook several pieces of paid work where directors worked for free For example, on the main contract that we undertook (Accrington Coppice and Arden Hall Larch thinning) volunteer hours totalled 291 hours Based on a volunteer figure of £7 50 per hour that totals £2,183 of volunteer support In addition we have also built up a relationship with the Joinery department at the local Accrington and Rossendale College The result of this is that their students will be volunteering on another woodland management scheme on the Coppice in winter 2013 Students will help remove timber that will then be taken back to the college where it will be made into products such as raised beds that will be installed on another community project in the town

Overall, we feel that Woody has provided a lot of community benefit in Hyndburn this year. Any surplus we make will be used to reinvest in the business, providing training and also towards woodland projects in the borough
